In 2015, VCF expanded the Critical Response program in partnership with the Ministry of Health, to focus on the 25 Northern provinces, prioritizing the poorest provinces. The program aims to prevent needless death of children in rural areas, where access to health care is the worst in the country.

Critical Response trains doctors and nurses in Pediatric Advanced Life Support. The program also provides crash carts, equipped with all the equipment and tools needed to save children.



PALS program training of VCF is very useful to me. I had opportunity to join in such a professional and exciting course like this. 




