The VinaCapital Foundation (VCF) is a USA-registered 501-c3 public charitable organization, licensed as an international non-governmental organization in Vietnam. Founded in 2006, VCF's mission is to create healthcare and education solutions to transform the lives of underserved and marginalized children and women in Vietnam. The work of VCF touches the lives of millions of Vietnamese in 63 provinces every year.

OUR VISION

A thriving Vietnam where all children and women are healthy, educated and empowered to benefit from economic growth and contribute to improvements in their communities.

OUR MISSION

Create healthcare and education solutions to transform the lives of underserved and marginalized children and women in Vietnam.



We invest in 3 main areas:

GRASSROOTS MEDICAL PROGRAMS:

Heartbeat Vietnam: funds children's heart surgeries, including pre- and post-operative care;

Rural Outreach Clinic: provides free health examination for children in remote areas;

Care to Rise: accesses, protects, encourages, and provides long-term care to Covid-19 orphans until adulthood;

Grassroots assistance: specialized care, nutrition and psychosocial activities for children and their parents.

HEALTHCARE CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS:

Survive to Thrive - Critical Response: provides training and equipment for emergency and neonatal care in rural hospitals;

Clean Water: installs filtration systems to provide potable water for underserved communities;

National Emergencies: organizes and implements disaster and pandemic relief.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS:

Brighter Path: educates and transforms ethnic minority female students with scholarships, mentoring and Annual Empowerment Meeting.

Brighter Path Girls' Clubs: provide life-changing knowledge and soft skills training in legal rights, sexual and reproductive health, financial literacy and leadership so ethnic minority girls become agents of change in their rural communities.

Across every program runs deep commitments to children's and women's rights, gender equality, improved nutrition, environmental protection and poverty reduction.

CEO's Letter



Dearest Friends,

I am proud to present the Annual Report for 2021 to those of you who have supported VinaCapital Foundation's (VCF) work and to those who have an interest in learning more about us.

My annual program presentation always starts with the grateful acknowledgement for the two visionaries, Don Lam and Robin King Austin, who created VCF in 2006 and laid a solid foundation for a future of saving the lives of children, improving the lives of girls and their mothers and building the middle class of Vietnam. It is important to note also that VinaCapital Group funds all the overhead of VCF so that all other donations go 100% to the program the donor chooses.

With nearly 9,000 heart children assisted during the year, billions of dong in medical training and equipment, the expansion of our ethnic girls' education program, life-changing clean water solutions, VCF operates in all 63 provinces and impacted the lives of 2,072,323 people in 2021, it was a busy year. The VCF staff worked "double and triple hard" to accomplish these achievements in 2021. The accomplishments were achieved despite the lockdown and other hurdles caused by the pandemic. In fact, we added a new Covid-19 permanent program to our portfolio in 2021 along with 2 Covid projects. Our fundraising exceeded budget and year 2020 income. The seasoned back and middle office teams excelled throughout the year to keeping overhead expenses in line with income and apply surplus funds to critical Covid-related needs. The Marketing and Communications team stepped up many times with creative solutions for the successful public presentation of our work while continuing to promote the existing program portfolio of outstanding results.

Our income increased 20% from the previous year 2020. Despite Covid-19, Heartbeat Vietnam operated at 88% of the previous year. Our extraordinary achievements include saving the lives cumulatively of over 8,400 children with congenital heart defects, initiating a comprehensive program for Covid-19 orphans, raising more than 1.5 million USD for ventilators and personal protective equipment, and other Covid-related activities, building a cutting-edge digital learning platform for ethnic Girls' Clubs, and much more as you will see below. All of these results were achieved under the epic challenges of the pandemic, with the support from our committed partners. Despite the challenges and hardships, we never stop striving to transform communities and build a more resilient Vietnam.

VCF's health and education programs are fundamental to the progress of any developing country. We work with local, provincial and the national government of Vietnam, bi-lateral funders, individuals and corporations to address specific gaps in the education and healthcare systems. VCF harmonizes with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals in all of our program work. We believe that improvements in gender equality and women's rights are greatly enhanced by providing healthy children and mothers and empowering vulnerable and marginalized girls. VCF's program work has been recognized by government leaders and other third party evaluators at the national and international levels as some of the most relevant and effective in Vietnam. Solutions are evidence-based and data-driven, but we must never forget that every data point represents beneficiaries who suffer. Every beneficiary has a life-changing story to tell because of your support for VinaCapital Foundation.

The program funds life-saving heart surgeries for financially disadvantaged children under 18 years old in Vietnam to treat congenital heart defects (CHD) and supports their families with living expenses to ensure a better quality of life for the children and their mothers.

DAT KY'S STORY:

Saving a Heart, Building a Future

Having corrected the transposition of the great arteries, a serious congenital anomaly, Dat Ky had to undergo two surgeries, one when he was only 3 years old and then again when he was 6. Since his family could not afford the huge surgery cost of more than 3,000 USD, VCF's Heartbeat Vietnam program sponsored his heart operation in April 2018 at the Ho Chi Minh City Heart Institute. Since then, he still visits this hospital every 3–6 months for checkups on his Aortic Valve Regurgitation and takes medicine regularly. His latest checkup was in early December 2021 and the doctor confirmed his heart's health is stabilizing.



Ky is a Hoa ethnic minority (which means he has Chinese ancestry) and he has a sister that is two years younger than him. Ky's sister has a problem called Aplastic Anemia which means her body does not produce enough blood cells, leaving her fatigued and more prone to infections and uncontrolled bleeding. Ky's father passed away in 2015 because of lung disease. His mother works hard as a supermarket staff to earn 174–217 USD per month so that she can afford to raise her two children, paying their school fees and medical treatment. The three of them are living with Ky's aging grandparents' family including a paralyzed uncle, and an aunt and her husband.

Dat Ky and his whole family were infected with Covid-19 and were heavily affected by the pandemic during its 4th wave in Ho Chi Minh City. During the lockdown, Ky's mom was unemployed for two months and had to stay at home to take care of her family. Luckily, they are now all recovered and healthy, while Ky's mom returned to work as well. Despite the hardship, Ky's mom managed to maintain her children's health, nutrition, and education. Ky is in grade 4 and his sister is in grade 2 and they took turns using their mother's old cell phone to study.

Touched by the family's condition and Ky's wish to continue with his education, VCF donated a brand-new laptop for him and his sister to study online. Seeing a laptop for the first time in his life, Ky and his mother could not hold back their emotions. The boy quickly learned how to use the device with joy and promised to use it for his studies, sharing it with his sister. This laptop ensures the quality of their education, protects their eyesight, improves the educational outcome and enables them to access a world of possibilities that enriches and strengthens their futures.




Outreach Clinics




A mobile medical clinic program that provides free medical examinations for children who have limited or no access to health services in rural marginalized underserved communities of Vietnam, increasing the early detection of heart defects in children, and training provincial doctors in the diagnosis and treatment of these sick children.

In 2021, more than 9,700 children received free heart screenings, 186 of whom were diagnosed with congenital heart defects, and 157 of whom required heart surgeries and received immediate support from the Heartbeat Vietnam program. 344 adults in these provinces also had their blood pressure checked for hypertension/hypotension detection and treatment.



Providing health checks with care and innovation

In the second year of Covid-19, the **Rural Outreach Clinics** team continued to travel across the country with more vigilance and thoughtfulness than ever. We were determined to reach deeper into remote regions, where quality healthcare remains inaccessible to the majority of the population. Every clinic was operated carefully to ensure they abided by the policy of pandemic prevention from the **Ministry of Health** including the use of face masks, hand sanitizer, and sterilization of equipment.

We also focused on organizing clinics in schools and commune health centers so that students and families have their health checks right where they live, on a smaller and more local scale, rather than in district hospitals or big gathering spaces that required rural residents to travel far and have a mass crowding that could lead to virus transmission. This helped us control and limit the number of people, which allowed for social distancing and effective preventive measures.

Not only screening children for congenital heart defects, the health examinations also checked adults for and raised awareness about other diseases such as hypertension and diabetes. By offering more kinds of checkups and education, the program hopes to continue delivering knowledge and quality healthcare services to the most underserved and disadvantaged communities all over Vietnam in the future, for a healthier and stronger nation.

Grassroots Assistance

At the VinaCapital Foundation, we are innovators and problem-solvers, often times where others have tried to help and failed. We employ scientific, evidence-based sustainable development work, but we also take great joy in providing help when there is great need or reluctance by others to help because of bias, lack of funding or, more often, just a lack of will.

We help poor sick children who have unusual medical problems and we believe that psychosocial issues for hospitalized chronically ill children are just as important as traditional treatment. Workshops for patients’ families, hospital “fun” rooms, holiday celebrations and spontaneous hospital entertainment are all factors that contribute to the most effective healing process.



H'On Mlo - A Clubfoot Girl with Perseverance and Aspirations

In December 2020, being the first to walk on stage to receive a scholarship for distinguished ethnic minority students in Dak Lak, H'On Mlo easily stood out with her uniqueness. It did not take Rad, VCF's CEO, and H'Hen Nie, Miss Universe Vietnam 2017, very long to notice her unusual limp when they handed the little Ede girl the scholarship certificate.

H'On Mlo was born with clubfoot – a congenital birth defect that causes one or both soles of the feet to turn inward and upward. For the last 13 years, H'On has learned how to walk on the side of her left foot and to make friends with the pain that comes with every step in her foot, ankle, and leg. She also became acquainted with humiliation by other children because of her disability. Her poor family believed her deformity could not be fixed. Even if they wanted to fix it, they would be unable to afford the cost of the treatment for H'On's clubfoot. Her dad, the breadwinner of a family of six, doesn't have a job and the income is unstable.

After the VCF team left the event, their hearts were heavy with the image of a bright girl having difficulty walking for the rest of her life, hence many of her dreams would not be fulfilled. Much discussion was had, and our team made the decision to embark on a journey to “**help H'On Mlo walk proudly with her peers**”.

We brought the little girl from Dak Lak to HCMC for her first-time ever thorough checkup in early 2021. The doctor said H'On Mlo would end up having a lifetime disability if she didn't get treatment soon enough. The estimated cost for her treatment (casting, orthopedic surgery, post-surgery care, physical therapy, and follow-up costs) came



to **150,000,000 VND** (equivalent to \$6,500) – an unimaginable number compared to her family's financial condition. Luckily, miracles do come to those who yearn for them. Through our fundraising call on VCF's social media and email newsletter, after only 3 weeks of solicitation, we raised **\$8,185** to treat H'On Mlo's deformity.

The campaign quickly surpassed the original goal, and the amount of love, encouragement and support we received exceeded all of our expectations. With the invaluable support of Miss Universe Vietnam 2017, H'Hen Nie – who is also Ede, and many kind and generous hearts around the world, the amount raised was sufficient to cover H'On's treatment fees – including multiple castings, orthopedic surgery, post-surgery care, physical therapy, and follow-up costs. Any funds remaining after those devoted to the medical procedures will be used to enhance her educational opportunities.






Throughout the pandemic year, H'On Mlo was having her clubfoot cast and re-cast a few times and had to wait more than 6 months for her surgery, due to the historic Covid-19 outbreak in Ho Chi Minh City. Finally, in December 2021, a year after we first met, H'On had her clubfoot successfully operated on at the Ho Chi Minh City Hospital for Traumatology and Orthopaedics. Despite the post-surgery pain, H'On remained strong and positive about her recovery and future. She came home with a bandaged foot and newfound joy that she was finally healing.

In January 2022, VCF visited H'On Mlo and her family in Dak Lak, this time with so much happiness and hope radiating from the joy of the little girl's family. In February 2022, H'On came back to HCMC twice to have her leg brace made and fit, which now helps her to walk normally without a cane. As a result, H'On Mlo can walk properly and proudly with her foot in the correct position, with the brace's support, and will continue to have checkups and physiotherapy sessions with doctors. The VCF team is following up with her family closely to ensure H'On receives the medical assistance she needs so that she can completely recover with a strong healthy foot for the rest of her life. In 2 years she will be able to walk normally without any assistance.

Care To Rise



VCF partners with the HCMC Youth Union to provide for, protect and encourage the 2,345 orphans and disadvantaged children created by the Covid-19 pandemic to adulthood.

Launching the Care to Rise program to support disadvantaged children affected by the Covid-19 pandemic

In order to support disadvantaged children affected by Covid-19 to stabilize their lives, ensure their rights as prescribed by law, and narrow the gap in living standards between Covid-19 orphans and other children, on the afternoon of November 25, 2021, VinaCapital Foundation (VCF) in collaboration with the Youth Union of Ho Chi Minh City (YU of HCMC) organized an MOU Signing Ceremony to implement the Care to Rise program.

Care to Rise is an outgrowth of the existing successful partnership between VCF and YU – the Grassroots Assistance Program (GAP) - [Read more about GAP on page 25](#). The Care to Rise program’s purpose is to provide for, protect and encourage more than 2,000 orphans created by the Covid-19 pandemic to adulthood.



To kick off the program, in November 2021, VCF donated 35 laptops to disadvantaged children impacted by Covid-19 in HCMC and Da Nang city so they can study like their peers. The program is divided into 3 phases with sufficient support for the children in each period of time. In December, 100 Youth Union surveyors were trained to implement the first phase of the program.



PHASE 1 completed 1,924 detailed in-home surveys to fully assess each beneficiary and their new environment, and determine 3 crucial areas of need:

- (1) *Nutrition and other basic needs*
- (2) *Health/vision/dental issues and anxiety disorders caused by the abrupt loss of parents and dislocation*
- (3) *The ability to attend and/or perform school education requirements that currently necessitate having internet and communication devices*

The database indicates that:

- 66%** of the orphans are under 12 years old.
- 78%** of the children have anxiety disorders – 6% of which are severe.
- 75%** of the children have myopia - **72%** of which require glasses to correct their vision.
- 45%** of the children who fall into the undernourished category requires immediate food supplements and future training to change caregiver behavior.

PHASE 2 with remedial assistance will be implemented in 2022.

The International Chairman of the Care to Rise program - Dr. Philipp Rösler, Former Vice-Chancellor of Germany, Honorary Consul of Vietnam to Switzerland

In January 2022, VCF was proud to announce that Dr. Philipp Rösler, Former Vice-Chancellor of Germany, Honorary Consul of Vietnam to Switzerland, had been appointed the International Chairman of the Care to Rise program. In this meaningful role, Dr. Rösler is committed to using his voice and influence to raise awareness and support from the international community to assist orphans and disadvantaged children impacted by Covid-19 in his birth country Vietnam. An agreement was signed by the 2 parties to recognize this important partnership.



Dr. Rösler is a Vietnamese-German cardiothoracic surgeon and former politician who served as the Minister of Health, the Minister of Economics and Technology, the Vice-Chancellor of Germany from 2011 to 2013, and recently the Honorary Consul of Vietnam to Switzerland.

Born in Soc Trang, Vietnam, Rösler was the first cabinet minister and vice-chancellor of Asian descent in Germany. He became the Chairman of the Advisory Board of VinaCapital Ventures in 2019 and an independent board member of Loc Troi Group in 2020.



Free comprehensive health examinations for the orphans and disadvantaged children

In February 2022, in collaboration with the HCMC Young Physicians’ Association, VCF and YU of HCMC examined and provided medicines to 1,031 children affected by Covid-19 in two days with the support of 44 doctors, 100 volunteers, and other stakeholders.

The health examination results indicate that so many children are having serious health problems such as psychiatric complications, vision problems, lack of proper nutrition, dental issues, and more. Noticeably, there are 323 children diagnosed with psychiatric problems while 248 have vision issues, and the number of children with other physical health issues is 187.

The health status of every single child will be stored in the program’s database for further follow-ups and periodic checkups in the future.


The long-term care with health and education services, PHASE 3, will carry the program through the future pathway forward to adulthood for each child.

Survive to Thrive – Critical Response

The program provides pediatric emergency training and fully stocked emergency crash carts for pediatric resuscitation and cardio therapy for emergency departments, as well as neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) equipment and training for hospitals to reduce infant mortality and build capacity for neonatal care in regional centers and rural hospitals throughout Vietnam.

“SURVIVE TO THRIVE” PROJECT
IN LAI CHAU PROVINCE

Ministry of Foreign Affairs
of the Republic of Bulgaria
& VinaCapital Foundation to
implement “Survive to Thrive”
Project in Lai Chau to reduce
infant mortality

On 20 December 2021, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of The Republic of Bulgaria and the VinaCapital Foundation (VCF) signed a Grant Agreement to implement the “Survive to Thrive” project to provide essential neonatal equipment and training for 2 hospitals in Sin Ho and Nam Nhun district, Lai Chau province. The project contributes to VCF’s commitment to reduce infant mortality and build capacity in Vietnam’s healthcare system.



This Grant Agreement to VCF’s Survive to Thrive program totals **BGN 62,572 (USD 36,000)**, which is funded by Bulgarian Official Development Aid. The project will provide 18 pieces of neonatal equipment for 2 remote hospitals in Lai Chau in a 3-month implementation period. These 2 districts are among the 74 the Prime Minister has identified as the highest priority for assistance. The medical equipment includes 2 continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) machines to treat acute respiratory failure, 2 phototherapy machines for neonatal jaundice, 2 SPO2 oximeters, 2 infant warmers, 2 intubation kits, 4 injection pumps, and 4 infusion pumps. These devices will help complete the neonatal units in the 2 hospitals in predominantly ethnic districts.



Through the provision of essential neonatal equipment accompanied by the necessary training on the equipment, doctors and nurses in rural and remote areas like Lai Chau will be able to provide babies with basic neonatal care and emergency treatment from their very first breath. According to the Vietnam National Children’s Hospital, the utilization of neonatal medical equipment has a major clinical impact, including a 75% reduction in 24-hour mortality from respiratory distress syndrome achieved after the introduction of the CPAP machine.



Since its inception, **VCF’s Survive to Thrive program** has donated **293** pieces of neonatal care equipment to neonatal intensive care units of **53** hospitals in: Ho Chi Minh City, Da Nang, Kon Tum, Cao Bang, Son La, Bac Kan, Ha Giang, Yen Bai, Khanh Hoa, Quang Nam, Quang Ngai.

In over 16 years, **123,303 babies** were treated thanks to VCF’s donations of equipment.


Clean Water



The program installs water filtration systems at hospitals, commune health centers, schools, and underserved communities in Vietnam. By providing safe drinking water to hospital patients and school children, VCF's Clean Water Program improves the quality of life for the direct beneficiaries and their families and is the foundation for all sustainable improvements in their communities.

49 Water Filtration Systems in 23 Schools Valued 2 Billion VND and 100 Scholarships Granted to Vinh Hung District, Long An Province

With the donation of VinaCapital GS Energy Pte. Ltd., VinaCapital Foundation (VCF) provided 49 clean water filtration systems to all Vinh Hung district schools, Long An province. Benefits to **960 staff and teachers as well as 11,342 students** will ensure improved health by reducing water-transmitted diseases for years to come. Student school attendance and learning retention levels will increase resulting in a higher likelihood of continued education and ultimately greater employability.

Located in the northwest of Long An province and in a remote rural area of Dong Thap Muoi, bordering Cambodia, Vinh Hung district is heavily affected by floods and saltwater intrusion every year. The region has limited water resources, lacking clean water for drinking and daily purposes. Unsafe water is one of the major reasons for reduced quality of life and negatively impacts public health, especially in the development of children.

The project was carried out from January to April 2021.

In January 2021, VCF installed 21 clean water systems in 13 kindergartens and primary schools.

In April 2021, 28 systems were implemented in 10 secondary and high schools.



At the ceremony, VinaCapital GS Energy Pte. Ltd., VCF also awarded 100 scholarships to 100 poor students in Vinh Hung district, motivating them to stay in school and lift the burden off their families. This project was implemented through the **“Clean Water for Schools”** program – an initiative founded by Former President of State Truong Tan Sang and Mr. Pham Phu Ngoc Trai, Chairman of Global Integration Business Consultants (GIBC) and Board Member of VCF.

National Emergencies

CENTRAL VIETNAM DISASTER RELIEF

In 2020, Quang Nam province was heavily damaged by 7 weeks of continuous tropical storm flooding and 2 typhoons, especially Nam Tra My district. The storms destroyed much of the healthcare infrastructure provided by the 11 medical facilities in this district that serve 27,297 people, about 15,000 of whom are children under 20 years of age. Each commune health center (CHC) serves about 2,500 residents and each center serves about 400 patients per month.

Rebuilding medical infrastructure and providing mobile healthcare clinics in Nam Tra My district

Since October 2020, VCF's Our Hearts to Central Vietnam Campaign asked for donations to support thousands of people in the affected regions, has successfully raised over 5.6 billion VND (an equivalent of 250,000 USD). In November 2020, the campaign provided 12,000 people with emergency relief packages of basic food and necessities.



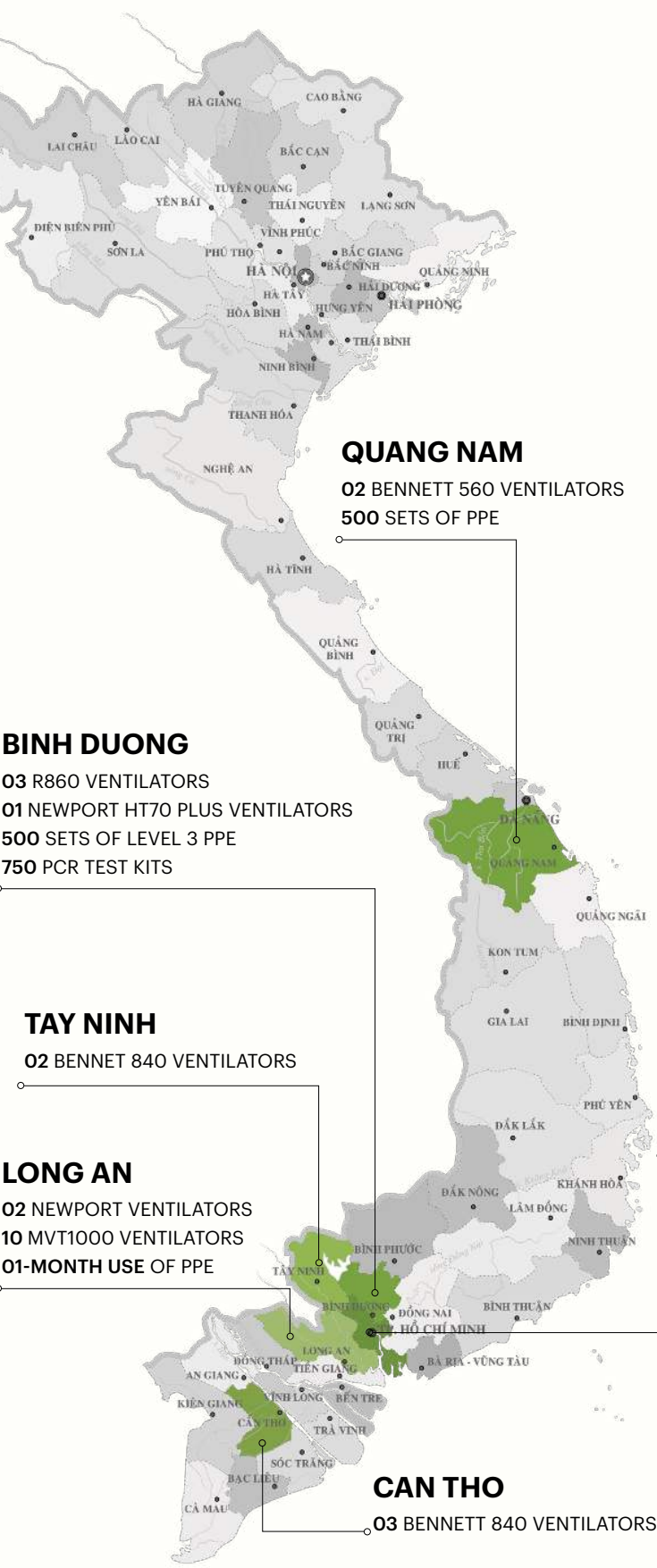
From January 2021, the campaign focused on rebuilding medical infrastructure and providing mobile healthcare clinics in Nam Tra My district. The structural repairs were implemented at the district hospital and 3 other CHCs in Tra Cang, Tra Don and Tra Leng communes. Four mobile clinics in Tra Leng, Tra Van, Tra Nam, and Tra Tap communes have provided free health examinations for 3,133 children and adults in rural areas. The provision of clean water filtration systems and standard kits of medical equipment has been delivered to all 11 medical facilities of the district.



VCF partnered with the HCMC Fatherland Front to donate breathing equipment and personal protective equipment to frontline healthcare workers

From July to November 2021, VCF implemented the **Help Vietnam Breathe** program to provide desperately needed breathing equipment and personal protection gear (PPE) to the overwhelmed hospitals and other temporary medical facilities, and frontline healthcare workers, especially in Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC) and hard-hit surrounding provinces. VCF collaborates with the Fatherland Front of HCMC and other local authorities to deploy the equipment to the areas of most severe critical need.

The **Help Vietnam Breathe** program raised over 1.5 million USD, donated 57 ventilators, 1 ECMO and 10,050 sets of PPE to hospitals and medical facilities in 6 cities and provinces which are HCMC, Long An, Can Tho, Tay Ninh, Binh Duong and Quang Nam. The devices were immediately put into use to promptly assist the healthcare system in treating Covid-19 patients and protect the safety of healthcare workers.





HELP VIETNAM BREATHE

Saving lives in the middle of Covid-19

In August, a fifty-six-year-old woman survived a 17-day battle with Covid-19 at Hau Nghia hospital in Long An province, thanks to one of the ventilators donated by the “Help Vietnam Breathe” campaign.

At 3 PM on August 3rd, Ms. Hien* was admitted to Hau Nghia hospital with respiratory failure, severe pneumonia and tested positive for Covid-19. She was not given much of a chance but was immediately placed on a ventilator from VinaCapital Foundation and given antibiotics. After 6 days of intensive treatment, her health improved, and she no longer needed to use a ventilator. This meant that she could have her intubation removed and switched over to a low-cost non-invasive oxygen supply. Ten days later, Ms. Hien, fully recovered, was completely weaned off the oxygen generator and discharged.

Hien is one of the thousands of critical cases lucky to recover. Her determination to live inspired everyone to keep fighting regardless of their prognosis. During the previous 4 months, the doctors and nurses at Hau Nghia Hospital, and all over Vietnam, worked devotedly, including long shifts – days and nights, to take care and preserve the lives of thousands of Covid-19 patients like Hien. The VCF team is proud to contribute to the healthcare system’s challenging mission, protecting frontline heroes’ safety, and saving their patients’ lives.

This story highlights the importance of critical Covid-19 treatment equipment and the positive impact of VinaCapital Foundation’s Help Vietnam Breathe campaign to outfit hospitals properly. **Over \$1.5 million** of ventilators/ECMO were provided alone and every donation is important. We have received hundreds of donations from July to November 2021 – from children’s piggy banks to the largest multinational corporations in the world. Whether big or small, 100% of all donations contributed were used to benefit 20 beneficiary hospitals as far as Da Nang in the north to Long An in the south.

GRASSROOTS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (GAP)

GAP addressed Covid-19 generated lockdown problems in HCMC such as Vietnamese families’ nutritional and other critical needs, assisting indigent dislocated foreigners, and providing support services for healthcare professionals battling the pandemic.



VCF partnered with the HCMC Youth Union to provide aid to more than 2,000 Vietnamese and expats who were plunged into poverty as a result of the pandemic in HCMC

By the end of September, the Grassroots Assistance program supported 1,113 foreigners and 1,000 Vietnamese in HCMC with essential goods packages, distributed 1,100 financial support gifts, 125 medicine packs for people in need and home-quarantined FO patients; and helped 218 foreigners to find jobs.

In the delivery of care packages, we had the chance to talk with Maria* – one of 13,000 foreigners trying to make ends meet due to the lockdown. Previously working full-time as a nanny, she lost her job when everything closed and was only working 1–2 hours a day or less.

I have not even been able to fly home to see my 11-year-old daughter for almost 3 years. My income has reduced greatly, and I do not have enough food. Brighter Path



BRIGHTER PATH SCHOLARSHIP

Brighter Path program empowers the brightest disadvantaged rural ethnic minority girls in Vietnam through formal and informal education and training

The program selects the most academically talented ethnic minority female scholars and awards them with full high school and university scholarships for 7 to 10 years. Personal mentoring, life skills training and an annual encouragement weekend are highlights of the program.

Since inception, this program has supported **1,143 scholars**.

BRIGHTER PATH GIRLS' CLUBS

The Brighter Path program, in partnership with Vu A Dinh Scholarship Fund, also initiated the Girls' Club to improve and empower a large number of disadvantaged ethnic minority female students through after-school club activities focused on four important knowledge gaps: sexual and reproductive health, leadership skill-building, financial literacy and understanding legal rights.

In 2021, **60** female students received scholarships and participated in the pilot Girls' Club in Thai Nguyen province.

The program also launched two Girls' Clubs in Quang Nam provinces with **120** participants.

Covid-19 financial support for Brighter Path girls and families

In July, VCF provided a 4,870 USD emergency financial support package for families of all 49 ethnic minority girl scholars of the Brighter Path program.

7 families which had no income during the outbreak received 175 USD per household, and 42 families which had their income reduced received 87 USD per household.

The financial gifts would sufficiently cover expenditures of basic necessities of their rural households over the following 3–6 months. This helped ensure not only the families' living conditions and physical health but also their mental wellbeing to stay encouraged to overcome the pandemic's heavy impact. The girls had been able to maintain their studies well and their parents were able to return to work.



HSBC Vietnam and VinaCapital Foundation to Implement "Brighter Path Girls' Club Digital Learning Platform" to Empower Ethnic Minority Female Students

On October 11, Mr. Tim Evans – CEO of HSBC Vietnam and Mr. Rad Kivette – CEO of VinaCapital Foundation signed the MOU to launch the Digital Learning Platform for Brighter Path Girls' Clubs – an initiative of VCF's Brighter Path program. HSBC Vietnam donated \$225,344 USD to VCF to build a digital learning platform for an initial 11 high schools, improving financial capabilities for 2,530 ethnic minority high school students in Vietnam over the next 2 years.

The project aims to optimize the power of advanced communications technology to empower and equip disadvantaged ethnic girls with critical financial understanding, which results in increasing women's economic involvement in Vietnam.

The financial capability curriculum is uniquely built for ethnic minority female high school students with local distinctive cultures, covering four components:

- (1) Budgeting and financial management
- (2) Understanding of financial services and products
- (3) Being a smart consumer
- (4) Setting goals

Project-based contests will also strengthen the learning process.

The ceremony coincided with the International Day of the Girl, which is observed every year on October 11, and included the theme **"Digital Generation"** providing access to educational technology for disadvantaged, marginalized, and underserved girls.

In early 2021, Girls' Clubs piloted in 2 ethnic boarding schools in Thai Nguyen province: Viet Bac Highland High School and Thai Nguyen Province Ethnic Boarding High School. The pilot exemplified the effectiveness and skill improvements as a solid formula for the girls' improvements. It is now believed that this initiative could create a sustainable foundation for the girls' growth and a clear pathway toward a brighter future. The Girls' Club is an effective low-cost model to overcome social prejudice and outdated paternalistic customs – obstacles endured by ethnic girls in Vietnam every day.



In 2022, the Girls' Clubs model is being replicated in an additional 13 ethnic high schools in Thai Nguyen, Quang Nam and Tra Vinh provinces with over 2,000 disadvantaged ethnic minority high school female students benefiting from the expansion.

Meet with
RAD KIVETTE

The persistent activist for Vietnam community

Six years ago, 17 female students from disadvantaged ethnic families received HSBC's Brighter Path Scholarships, a programme in partnership with VinaCapital Foundation. In addition, the sharing from HSBC personal female mentors in the early years at university also brought changes to their lives. Recently, the last four of them have graduated to stand in Vietnam's doctor workforce, to support and take care of the country and our people's health. On this occasion, HSBC Vietnam's In Focus talked with Rad Kivette, CEO of VinaCapital Foundation, about these meaningful programmes and sustainable development in Vietnam.

Having been in Vietnam for 21 years, how have you seen the development of CSR?

When I first arrived in 2000, there were international corporations "giving back", but it was all very much family-focused. Today, there's a much more scientific and businesslike approach to CSR. Most Vietnamese enterprises of all sizes are very aware of the importance of CSR in sustainable development and no longer think charity is something to practice at home only. Now it's the time to improve the quality of CSR to increase the effectiveness, outcomes and ROI. So when you see farsighted business people looking at "the triple bottomline" and the environmental, social, and governance (ESG) issues and planning their social investment, it's a good sign that funders are looking for social programs to support that meet real needs in a cost-effective way.

How important is it for a company to embed corporate sustainability into its operations?

It is critical today and becoming even more critical. According to Nielsen's 2014 Global Survey on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), 55 percent of global online consumers across 60 countries are willing to pay more for products and services from companies that are committed to positive social and environmental change.

The proven benefits that businesses gain when implementing social responsibility include increasing revenue, increasing brand value, increasing productivity, and more opportunities to access new market. These enterprises also have consolidated their reputation with customers, created loyalty and satisfaction with employees, as the entire supply chain becomes more committed to CSR driven sustainable development that complements other business strategy.



Pressure from buyers, industries, and competitors also creates a demand for businesses to follow and become a part of the Environmental Social Governance (ESG) movement. Investors are increasingly applying these non-financial factors as part of their analysis process to identify material risks and growth opportunities whilst making investment choices.

What role do companies such as HSBC play in these programmes and how do you see this role evolving?

Since 2014, HSBC has been contributing to all programs of the VinaCapital Foundation. The bank has helped save 37 children with congenital heart defects and sponsored Rural Outreach Clinics to screen 10,506 children in rural areas. VCF has also received over \$216,000 from HSBC to carry out Critical Response program activities, including implementing clean water systems and Central Vietnam's disaster relief response to help aid at risk communities. HSBC Brighter Path scholarships have helped 75 ethnic minority girls to stay in school and participate in Brighter Path Girls' Club pilot project in Thai Nguyen. Your donations total over \$380,000 and you have changed the lives of hundreds of thousands of people.

Teambuilding in March

The VCF team went on our long overdue staff retreat for the first time in our history. The team had the best time not only relaxing at The Grand Ho Tram Resort in Vung Tau, but also having the chance to sit back and talk about our visions for the future, as well as bond over a teambuilding session. The trip definitely refreshed us physically and mentally, helping us come back to work charged with energy and inspiration.



Working from home period

The second and third quarters of 2021 witnessed the catastrophic impacts of the fourth wave of Covid-19, this time much more devastating and complicated. The outbreak that first arose in late April/early May put HCMC in a prolonged social distancing period for nearly four months, with a four-digit number of cases every day. The VCF team worked from home from the end of May to October but continued to create impacts with our programs by saving lives, maintaining safety and education for our beneficiaries as well as assisting the healthcare system in the fight against the pandemic.



To ensure every staff member had access to enough food and medical supplies during this tough time, VCF sent care packages of vegetables and personal protective equipment to each staff in August and September. As not many people were able to buy these goods, the care packages helped sustain and protect the wellbeing of not only VCF staff but also their entire families.

The VCF team also started having weekly Zoom calls at the beginning of each week to provide updates on work and check on each other in terms of health, safety and wellbeing.

D&I training

In November, VCF staff attended a training on Diversity and Inclusion by the ICS center. All leaders and team members learned about the LGBTQ+ community, how to be an ally and best practices to apply to our working environment. This lesson strengthened our commitment to supporting the disadvantaged and marginalized, as well as engagement in D&I activities for building an inclusive and equitable office.

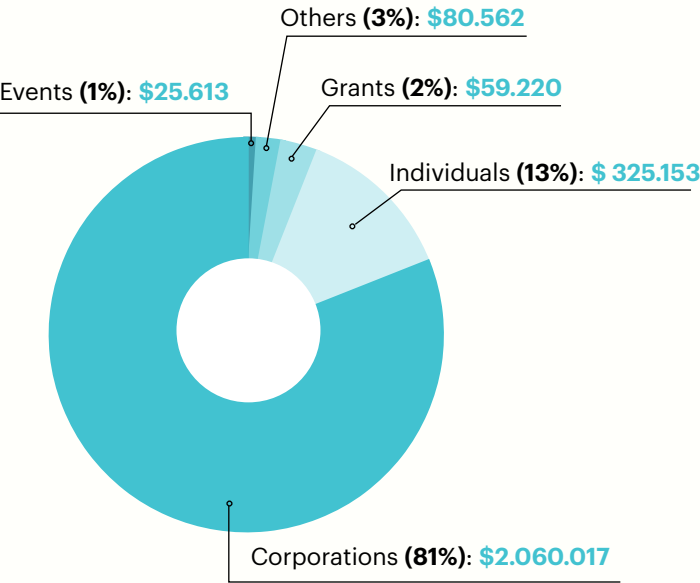

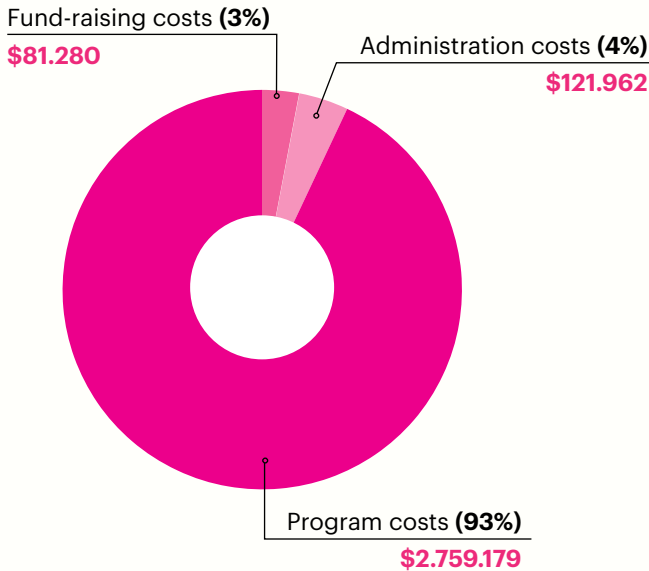
